

Baccalaureate Degree in Landscape Architecture

The Landscape Architecture (LDA) Program accepts students only once a year. Admission consideration is a two-step process. Students interested in earning a Bachelor in Landscape Architecture will need to submit a **University of California Undergraduate Application for Admission and Scholarships** at http://www.universityofcalifornia.edu/admissions/undergrad_adm/apply/apply_online.html during an open filing period. Students must meet the University and UC Davis selection and admission criteria. Undergraduate Admissions will notify students of their fall admission decision by May.

For acceptance into the LDA major, the student must also submit a portfolio directly to the Landscape Architecture program during February for program admission consideration for the following fall quarter. This portfolio application may be submitted in February prior to admission at UCD or during the first year of study as a **Pre-Landscape Architecture student** at UCD.

With the exception of Landscape Architecture (LDA) courses, most of the preparatory coursework can be completed at a California community college. Your community college adviser can help you create an academic plan to complete the requirements. You can speak to the Dean's Office about the college and university requirements that you may need to complete as part of the UC Davis degree. Contact information for the Dean's Office is below.

The student must also submit a portfolio directly to the Landscape Architecture program during February for program admission consideration for the following fall quarter.

Students must meet the University and UC Davis selection and admission criteria, as well as, be accepted by the LDA program through the portfolio process. Undergraduate Admissions will notify students of their fall admission decision by May.
